Initial certification trainings beginning October 1 and beyond must be NYCB approved, and training completion certificates must carry our individualized training approval badge to be accepted.

To ensure the value and integrity of the validated professional certifications offered by ASAP-NYCB, the Board determines standards for demonstrating that certification candidates are competent and ethical professionals.

These certification standards include evidence of suitable training, as confirmed by the Board's training approval process.
